Cheraman Juma Masjid, Kerala – 629 AD



First built - 629

An Arab preacher of Islam Malik Deenar built the mosque in Kerala. It is found that trade links between Arabia and the Malabar coastal region in India had been there before the advent of Islam. King of the Chera dynasty, Cheraman Perumal went to Arabia to meet Muhammad (S.A.W.). He embraced Islam and changed his name to Tajuddin. However, the mosque still bears the ruler's old name.

Palaiya Jumma Palli, Kilakarai, Tamil Nadu, India - 630 AD



Palaiya Jumma Palli (The Old Jumma Masjid of Kilakarai) or Meen Kadai Palli is a mosque in Kilakarai, Tamilnadu, India. Built in 628-630 AD, it is believed to be one of the oldest mosques in the world and along with Cheraman Juma Masjid in Kodungallur, Kerala, is the first mosque in India. It has an Islamic heritage of more than 1000 years. It is located in Kilakarai, an ancient port town in the South Indian state of Tamilnadu known for its Islamic culture.

It was built in 628-630 AD and was re-constructed in 1036. The mosque along with the others in the town is one of the greatest examples of Dravidian Islamic architecture. Old Jumma Masjid of Kilakarai is the most ancient place of worship in the entire country.

Malik Bin Deenar Juma Masjid, Kasaragod, Kerala - 642 AD (Hijrah 22)



This mosque was erected on 13th Rajab, 22 Hijrah (A.D.642) and Malik Ibn Muhammad was nominated as the Qazi of the mosque. Years later, the mosque was reconstructed in A.D.1809 (1223, Hijrah) by the generous help from the native people.

It contains the grave of Malik Ibn Mohammed; one of the descendants of Malik Ibn Deenar. An important local celebration takes place every year in commemoration of the arrival of Malik Ibn Deenar.
