From these tables (data/information), we get the following details:

In the world in mid 2009, the major **religious population**, viz., that of Christians was nearly 40 per cent, Muslims nearly 27 percent, Hindus nearly 17 percent where as Buddhists nearly 9 per cent and Jews only 0.26 per cent (Table 1; Fig. 1).

Out of thirty four selected countries (Table 5) the ranking in GDP lies from 1 (USA) to 104 (Jordan) and ranking in Military Spending (as % of GDP) 2007 lies from 1 (Oman) to 161 (Egypt).

In 2006 (Table 7), out of top World 14 **Oil Producers** Saudi Arabia was number 1 and Iraq number 14, out of top World 14 **Exporters** Saudi Arabia was number 1 and Kazakhstan number 14, out of top World 14 **Consumers** USA was number 1 and Italy number 14, and out of top World 10 **Importers** USA was number 1 and Taiwan number 10.

In 2009 (Table 9), out of Forty Eight Countries **Oil Consumption** of USA (18,690,000 bbl/per day) was on top and Bhutan was at lowest (1000 bbl/per day), whereas Saudi Arabia was at rank 8 (2,430,000 bbl/per day).

In 2010 (Table 10), out of ten **Greatest Oil Reserves** by Country, there were six Muslim countries with Saudi Arabia at number 1, Libya at 9 and Nigeria at 10.

Out of nine countries with Nuclear Weapons (Table 11), there is only one Muslim country i.e. Pakistan.

Out of forty selected countries (Table 12), the **Human Development Index (HDI)** of Norway is with rank 1, Australia 2, USA 4, UK 28, Qatar 37, Saudi Arabia 56, Malaysia 61, Iran 88, Pakistan 145, Bangladesh 146 and Congo with lowest rank 187.

In 2007, **HIV/AIDS** Prevalence Estimates out of selected fifty countries (Table 13) the number of cases in USA were 1,200,000 (0.6%), Sudan 3,20,000 (1.4%), Pakistan 96,000 (0.1%), Iran 86,000 (0.2%), Malaysia 80,000 (0.5%), UK 77,000 (0.2%), Australia 18000 (0.1%) and Israel 5100 (3%).

Recorded Rape Cases in selected forty one countries (UN Statistics) during 2009/100,000 (Table 14), there were 28.6 in USA, U K (England & Wales) 27.5, Israel 17.6, France 16.6, Oman 6.6, Bahrain 4.6, Sudan 2.9, Turkey 1.4 and Egypt 0.1 (only).

In 2007, **Percentage of Births to Unmarried Women** out of selected countries (Table 15), for Sweden was 66, France 50 (2004), UK 44 (2004), USA 40, Germany 30 and Japan 2.

In 2007, out of selected thirty countries **Adult Literacy Rate** (% of Adults Aged 15 and above) and Gross Enrolment Ratio (Table 16), lowest Adult Literacy Rate was that of Bangladesh with second lowest of Pakistan, at number six Saudi Arabia, UK at 25, USA at 26 and highest at number thirty Russia.

Out of hundred top ranking universities of Higher Education of the world (Table 17), there are 44 in USA, 10 in UK, 5 each in Japan and Netherlands, 4 each in Australia, France and Germany, 3 each in Canada, Hong Kong, Sweden and Switzerland, 2 each in China, Israel, Korea and Singapore and one each in Belgium, Brazil, Taiwan and Turkey (only one university in Muslim country).

Out of selected thirty four countries **Divorce Rate/1000** (most recent) with world weighted average 1.30, USA is on top (4.95), Russia at three (3.36), UK at four (3.08), Australia at 6 (2.52), Canada at 7 (2.46), Qatar at 12 (0.98), Turkey at 30 (0.37) and Sri Lanka lowest at 34 (0.15).

Out of selected fifty countries **GDP - Per Capita** (**PPP**) **2011** (est.) Qatar is on top with rank 2, USA 11, Australia 18, UK 33, Saudi Arabia 55, Russia 70, Turkey 86, Afghanistan 212 and Central African Republic being lowest 218.

Conclusion

The facts revealed by the data/information are very much worrying. The developed nations having higher Adult Literacy Rates and maximum of top 100 universities of the world, with higher resources (high GDP) and high HDI are also having higher prevalence of HIV/AIDS with higher number of recorded rape cases, higher divorce rates and higher percentage of births to unmarried women. Contrary to that of developed nations, the picture in Muslim countries is just opposite (Compact Table for 18 countries).

A new study has revealed that Hindus and Muslims are less likely than Christians and Jews to have premarital sex, and Muslims are least likely among people of these religious groups to get involved in extramarital sex (http://www.indianexpress.com/news/hindus-and-muslims-least-likely-to-engage-in-premarital-sex/1018549/).

Are the resources and education really making people educated in advanced countries? Are women getting due respect in the society? We have to think and act in that manner so that we can really create a global peaceful society with high moral standards.
