Religion-wise Percentage of Indian Women wear Head Coverings Outside of the Home - 2020

Head coverings are relatively common among Indian women.

In India, head coverings are worn by most women, including roughly six-in-ten Hindus.

In recent weeks, protests in India over <u>Muslim headscarves in schools</u> have gained international attention. The controversy began when a high school in the Southern state of Karnataka banned hijabs in classrooms, and demonstrations have since spread to other states.

Table 1 (below) shows about six-in-ten women in India (61%) say they keep the practice of covering their heads outside of their homes, according to a <u>Pew Research Center survey</u> conducted in 2019-2020. That includes a majority of <u>Hindu</u> women (59%), and roughly equal shares of Muslim (89%) and Sikh women (86%) – although the exact <u>type of head covering</u> can vary significantly among and within religious groups.

Table 2 (below) shows in South India women covering their heads outside of their homes: Hindu women (22%), shares of Muslim (83%) and Christian women (20%).


