Percentages in which Different Religious Communities Access Different Types of Schools

Different religious communities are likely to access private schools at different rates. Recent NSSO data suggests (Table 1) that:

- For all religious communities except Jains and Zoroastrians children enrol more than 45% in Government Schools
- A similar share of Hindu, Muslim and Christian children enrol in <u>Private Unaided Schools</u> (around 25%), but the share in smaller communities like Sikhs, Jains, and Zoroastrians is higher.
- All religious communities enrol their children from 10.5% to 24.4% in <u>Private Aided Schools.</u>
